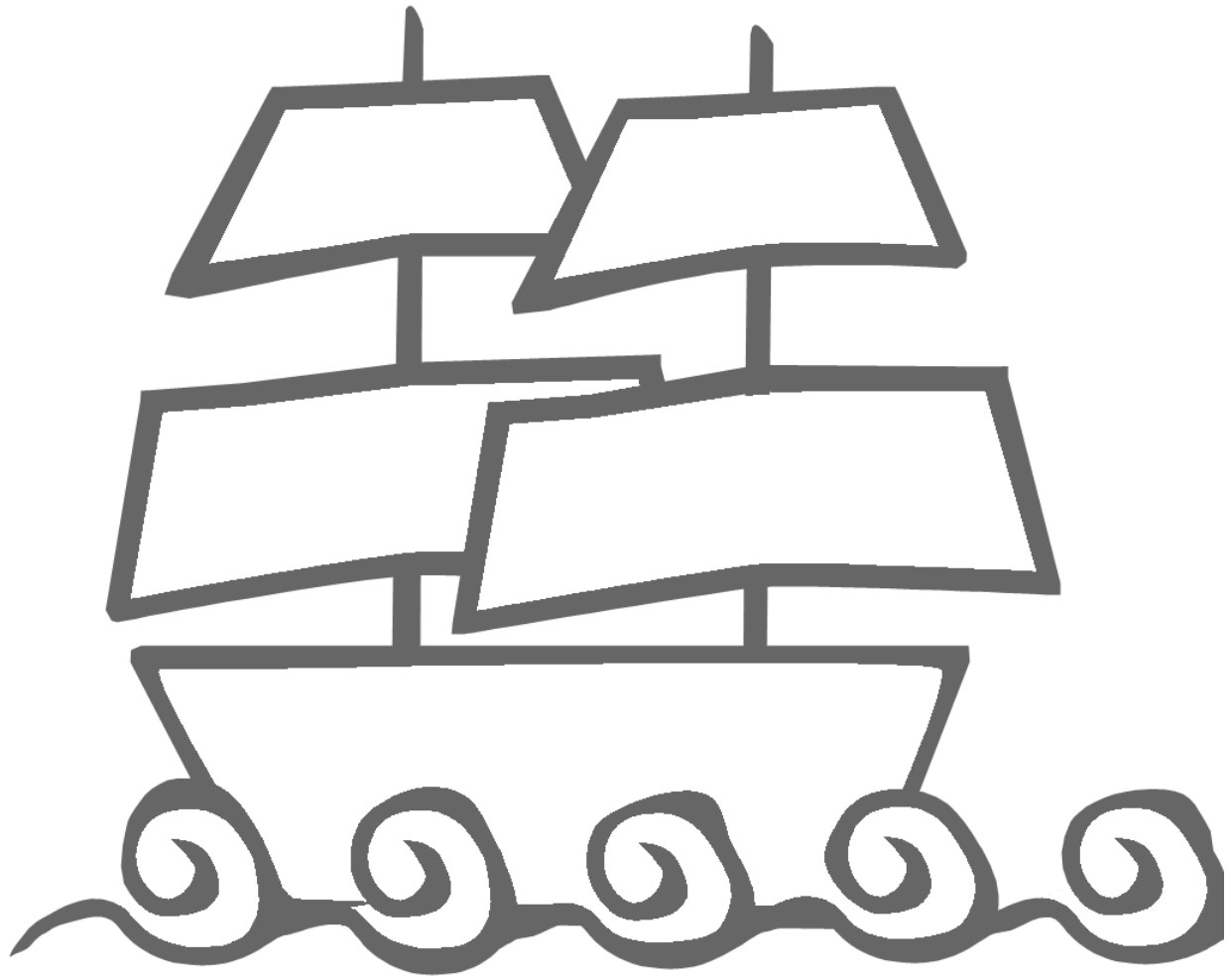


My Thanksgiving Book

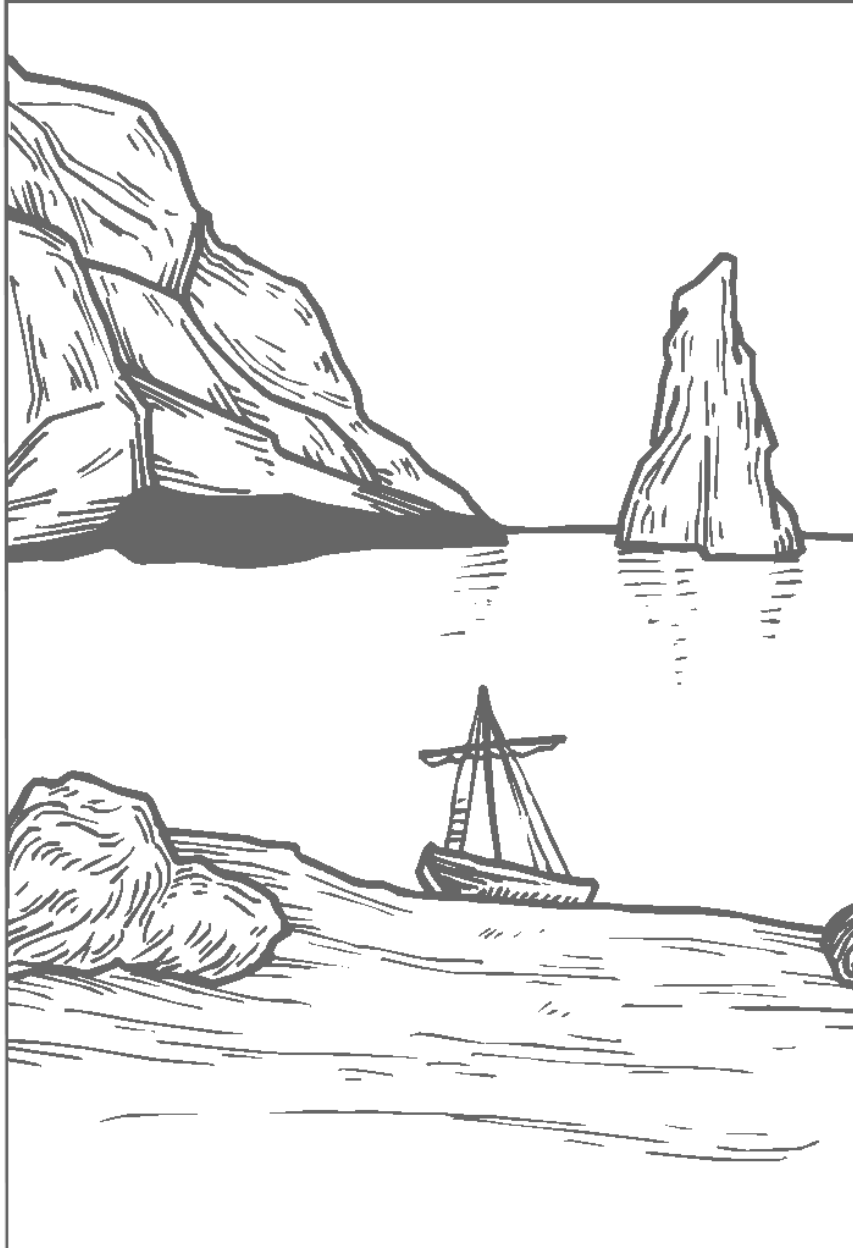




The Pilgrims came to America in 1620.



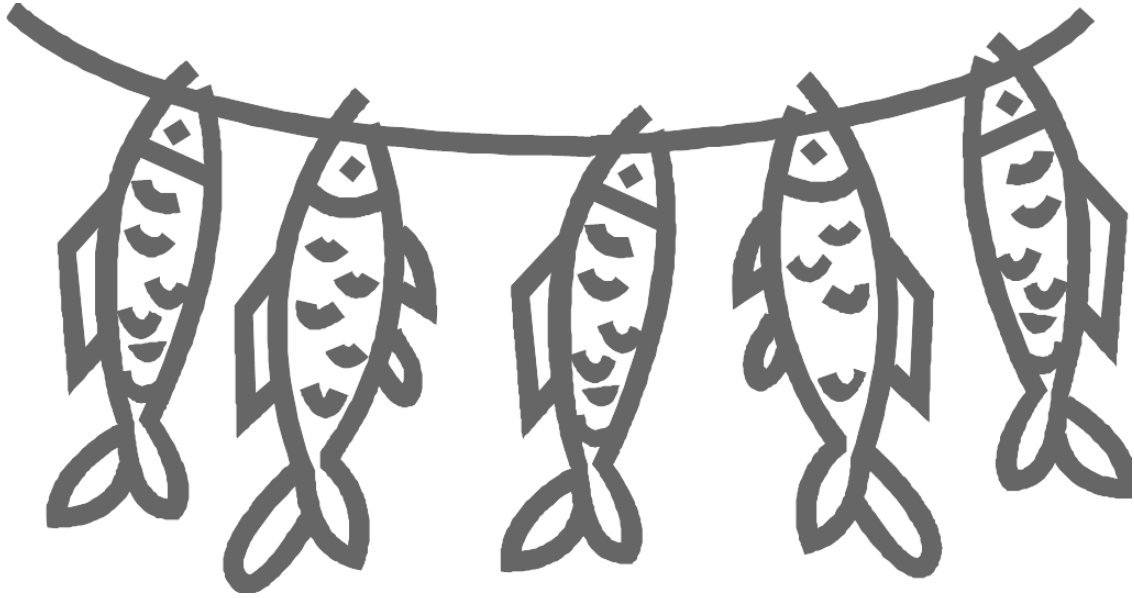
They sailed across the Atlantic on the

They planted corn and vegetables, picked berries, and caught fish.

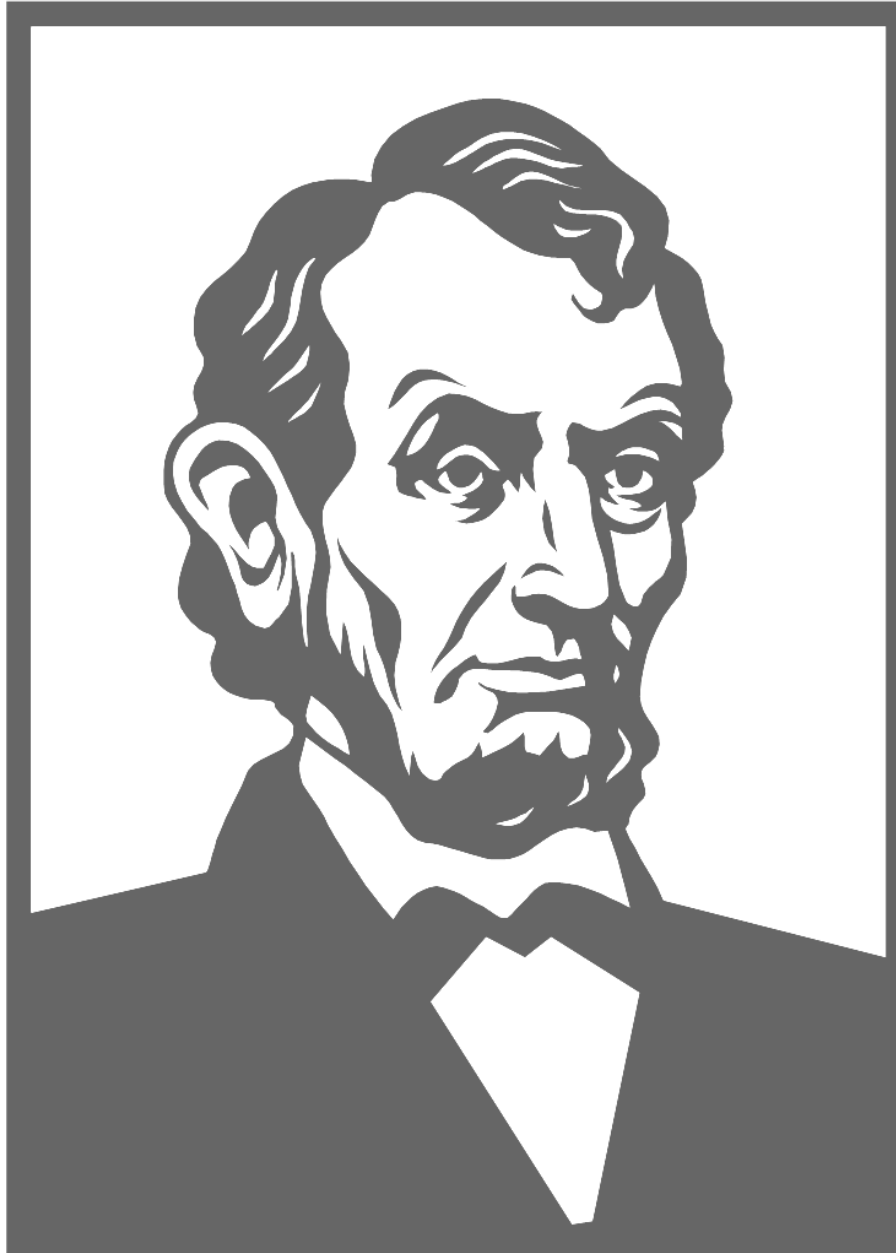


They hunted for turkeys.

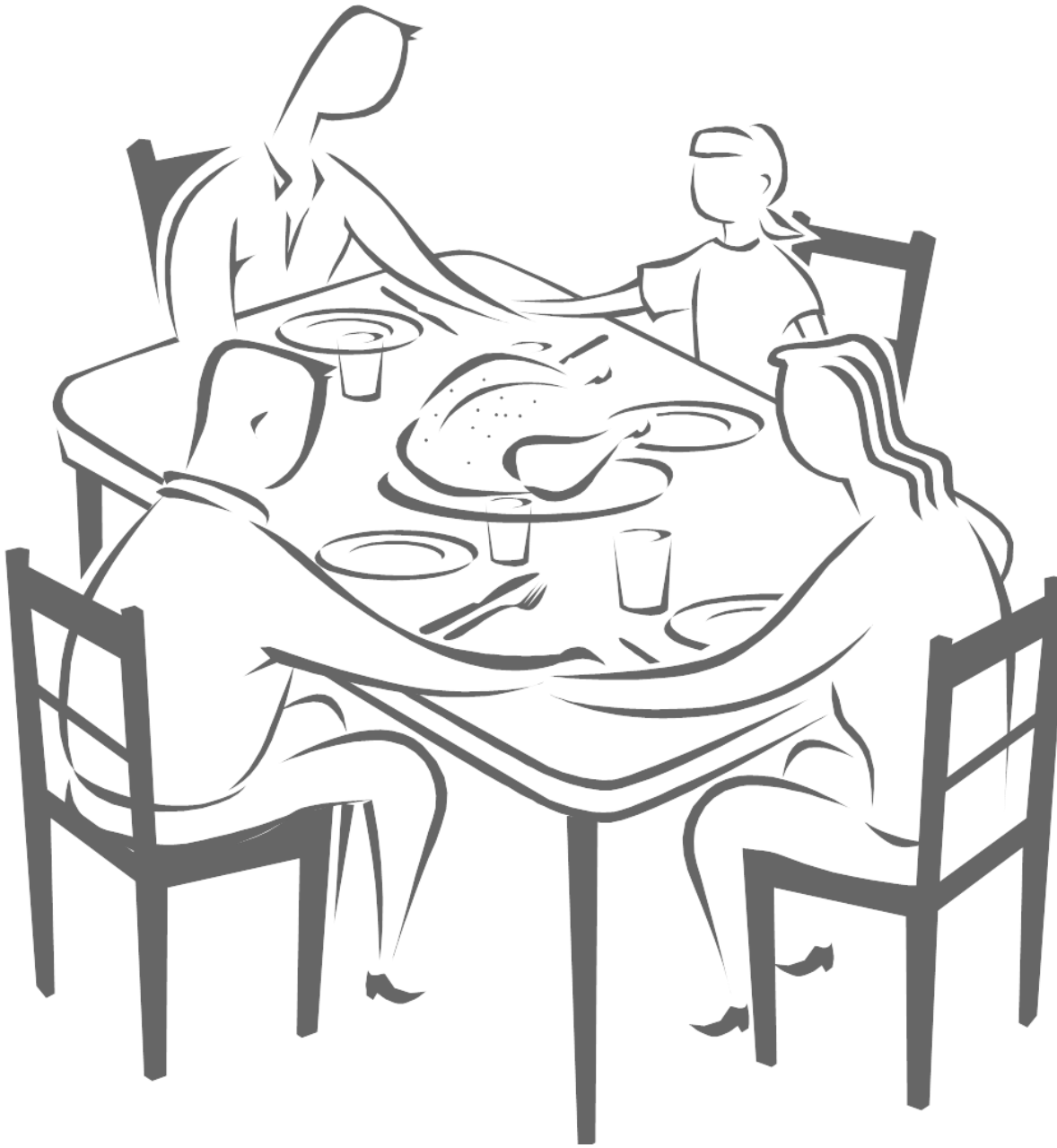


The Pilgrims invited the Indians to a feast to celebrate how God had taken care of them.
